# CONSULTATION RESULTS "LANCASHIRE LGBT - DEFINING THE FUTURE"



We were overwhelmed by the response to this survey - a total of 335 people took the trouble to complete the survey!

They included people who use our services or are members of groups we support; parents of LGB&T children; people from organisations that we work with; and many others who were new to us.

#### Key Findings :

- 88% agreed with our mission statement in its current form
- 49% were not aware of the services we deliver
- The 5 services we deliver that were most important to the respondents were:
  - Working with schools to combat bullying: 71%
  - o Information and support service: 66%
  - Support for local groups: 59%
  - Awareness raising with service providers: 58%
  - Advising on improvements to public services for LGBT people 51%
- Other services you would like us to deliver included:
  - Social/activity groups and events
  - o Services/support/activities for older LGBT people
  - o Mental health support and counselling
  - Support for young people
  - Sexual health services
  - Lesbian groups

- Other comments:
  - 52 people left comments. The majority were very positive comments about the work that we do
  - Many other comments were about the need to have a more visible presence and more publicity about our services
  - Other comments were about doing more for older lesbians and working closely with mental health professionals

A huge thank you to everyone who completed the survey! The results have gone to our trustees for discussion, and will inform our future planning.


#### **NEW YOUTH GROUPS IN FYLDE AND WYRE**

# "MIND OUT" ONLINE CHAT - MENTAL HEALTH SUPPORT FOR LGB&T PEOPLE

LGB or T and needing someone to talk to online? "Mind Out" the LGBTQ mental health support service in Brighton has an online service which can be accessed anywhere in the UK and even internationally, as long as you have access to the internet. Their <u>website</u> has opening times (look for the pink chat bubble on any page) and you start chatting by clicking the bottom right tab. The service is run by trained online support workers and mental health advocates who are ready to provide emotional support, information or signpost you in the right direction.



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
